

Instructions

to Adapt *We Serve Too!* from Army Orientation to a Marine, Navy, Air Force or Coast Guard Orientation

1. Download the text and illustration sheets from our website for the branch you want. There are 3 sheets per branch.
2. Print them out on your home computer^{*}, or
3. Take the file to a copy shop and have them make the copies for you^{**}.
4. If not printed on label paper, spray back of printed paper with spray adhesive[‡] (be sure to lay down a masking paper before spraying so you don't get sticky glue on everything!)
5. Cover the sticky side with a sheet of waxed paper.
6. Now, cut out the pieces along the lines. Look closely at your original book and see which ones need very close attention to the lines and which ones can have a little white space if you want your child to help cut. Some are easier than others.
7. One piece at a time, find the right page in the book, peel the backing off[⊕], position carefully over the Army picture or text,
(don't take too much pleasure here, remember we are all on the same team ☺) and secure in place, smoothing over entire sticker, especially the edges.
8. Now find a comfy place and read your new book!

** We have found Office Depot premium gloss presentation paper to work well for printing with an inkjet printer. It comes in a packet of 150 sheets, so you may want to join with others for this project.*

For laser printers you might be able to find glossy full sheet label paper or use gloss presentation paper made for laser printers.

*** Copy shops can usually use laser paper in their copiers. But ask for glossy paper and they can probably just do it for you without buying extra paper.*

‡ You can find spray adhesive in hobby or art stores, or scrap booking supply stores.

⊕ The label paper can really be hard to separate from the backing after it is cut out. One trick is to use a single edge razor blade to separate the two layers. (Obviously, this is NOT a preschool activity; it's probably just for grown-ups)
